If you have any ideas of how we can celebrate in preschool or would like to join in, please have a chat with your key person or Isabel.



To help us celebrate cultural and linguistic diversity and to support our activities this term, please could you send in any empty food packets, boxes or jars (clean please!) with writing on in languages other than English. We will be using these items to enrich our role play, ensuring that all of our families are represented within our setting. Thank you.

**Art Projects for School:** Look out for your child's festive artwork coming home soon! You can go online an order personalised merchandise, such as Christmas cards or tote bags, which will be delivered in time for Christmas. Please order by 21<sup>st</sup> November 2022.

**Snack-time:** To clear up any confusion about snack time: There is no need to send in snack every day for your child, and please do not send in anything other than fruit or vegetables which can be eaten raw. As stated in your welcome pack: We will offer your child a healthy snack during each session. Please support us with this, by providing a donation of fruit, or salad, or vegetables that

can be eaten raw, (e.g. apples, bananas, tomatoes, cucumber, carrots) once a week for all the children to share. We will offer your child a drink of milk or water at snack time. We have fresh water available throughout the day, for your child to drink.

Admissions to Primary Schools 2022: Do you have a child born between 1 Sept 2018 and 31 Aug 2019? You must apply online for a place at Primary School. **EYPP funding:** To support learning at home and the development of Communication and Language and Literacy for all of the children, we have used some of the Early Years Pupil Premium funding to purchase a copy of *The Lion and the Mouse*, for each child. We purchased the story books from "WOB", a fabulous online second hand book shop, which follows our ethos of sustainability and our commitment to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. We are currently enjoying sharing the stories with all of the children, and we will be sending a copy home for each child to keep and share with their family, along with ideas for learning at home, within the next few weeks. We hope you will enjoy sharing these books with your children.

Clothing & Footwear: If your child is coming to pre-school wearing their wellington boots or snow boots, please ensure that they have a pair of shoes or slippers to wear indoors, to ensure their comfort for the day. Please be aware that the pre-school building is not good at retaining heat, this means that, despite the heating being on, pre-school is colder than most homes, so please ensure that your child is dressed warmly, layers are a good idea. This is in addition to the warm coat and hats and gloves which are needed for outside, every day.

**Parent Readers:** The children love it when their parent/carer/grandparent or friends come to preschool to tell their favourite story, or read one of our books, to the children. Please chat to Isabel or Denise if you are able to do this.
